1569 Matters arising from the last meeting not elsewhere on agenda-

1571 Archive RON was thanked for the digitised archive which SH had found useful and legible. Since the last meeting there have been 7 changes to the planning situation in the WADRA area – shown in yellow. 1 was refused – Springwood in The Warren – excessive hard standing and insufficient information on flood risks. 4 were permitted (see sheet) and two still under consideration Cherrycroft in Upper Warren Avenue and 74 St Peters Avenue.

1576 Members observed the increased activity at Tonilla and High Ridge in Upper Warren Avenue and speculated about the management of deliveries when other permitted projects in the vicinity also started.

Mapledurham Playing Fields and Pavilion

1577 Management Committee Jane Bowen of Mapledurham Parish Council had contacted EM as Chair of the Management Committee querying its current status. EM said the committee members needed assurance that the Councillors were acting in the best interest of the Trust rather than RBC. It was probably the reason Councillors and officers had withdrawn from the Committee.

1578 Financial management of the Trust The news that there were no plans for the Trust to meet in 2025 was heightening concern about the finances of the Trust. Further to the discussion at the last meeting AM would discuss future action with Mark Corbett. RON suggested that Jane Bowen seek legal opinion from South Oxon D. C. also he would ask the auditors for their opinion. Action AM, RON.

1579 Deed of Dedication. Ongoing Action EM and John Holland

1580 Liaison with school- parking, lights, acoustics, use of pitches etc.

EM had recently discussed these issues with Hayley Harrison, the school headteacher. With respect to road safety, it had been decided to adopt a carrot and stick approach. The school, the head and the users rep from the management committee would write jointly to RBC asking for a safety scheme to help with parking and access issues particularly during school hours and football events. They would also address concerns about the crossing on the A4074 which could be improved by positioning a lollipop attendant and also improving lighting of waiting pedestrians. A forthcoming Sustrans initiative would help to highlight the walking to school policy over a two-week period. Numbered tickets would be given to children who did not arrive by car and small rewards given to those who collect the most. It was agreed that WADRA would contribute £50 to this.

1581 AM reported that he had enquired about using the MUGA and had been asked to pay a rental. He had pointed out that it was free to residents under the community use agreement which was clear on the affixed notice. He was then given the key code.

1582 Anti-Social Behaviour and neighbourhood safety

In the absence of JH this item was postponed
